

A Survey of Remuneration paid to Members of the Parliaments and Legislatures of the Commonwealth, 2004-2005

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PREFACE

Detailed information on the salaries, allowances, and privileges of Members in 76 Commonwealth Parliaments is set out in this volume.

From mid 2004 up until November 2005, the Parliamentary Information and Reference Centre circulated a questionnaire on parliamentary salaries and allowances to all Branches of the Commonwealth Parliamentary Association. The last survey was conducted in 2001.

This publication is unique in providing authoritative information in a form convenient for reference and comparison.

We would like to express appreciation to all Branch Secretaries who have co-operated in providing material, as without their assistance this publication would not have been possible.

We have generally reproduced the questionnaire in the way that they were answered, though in some instances it was necessary to refer to additional material to answer the specific questions.

In the interests of saving space, only those questions which each individual Branch responded to in the survey have been included. A complete copy of the questionnaire that was sent to each Branch has been included in pages 17 to 22, for reference purposes.

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

AFRICA

A **Kenya** Member's basic salary equals that paid to the Head of a Civil Service Ministry. Members receive allowances for attendance, housing, entertainment and their constituency expenses. MPs are members of a contributory group personal accident insurance scheme. Members are covered by a Medical Plan.

A **Lesotho** Cabinet Minister and the Presiding Officers receive a basic salary that is in the range of what is paid to the Head of a Civil Service Ministry. Members receive attendance, housing, and constituency allowances. Members receive a loan/duty-free concession to buy a vehicle. A communication allowance is paid but this does not cover stationery nor postage.

The basic salary paid to a Member in **Malawi** is less than half the amount paid to a secondary schoolteacher. Members receive a loan/duty-free concession to buy a vehicle. They can claim subsistence, constituency, utility and travel expenses.

Payments are made to Members in **Nigeria** who leave Parliament on retirement or after an electoral defeat. Members are entitled to travel, housing, constituency, communication and equipment allowances. An MP's basic salary equals the salary paid to the Head of a Civil Service Ministry. A Senator's salary is comparable to that of a Senior High Court Judge.

The salary of a Member in **Sokoto** is double the remuneration paid to a senior judge. Members are entitled to attendance, housing, constituency, travel, postage, stationery, and equipment allowances. Members receive a loan/duty-free concession to buy a vehicle.

In **South Africa** a Cabinet Minister's salary is comparable to the earnings of a senior judge in the Supreme Court or High Court. A Member's basic salary is less than the average salary paid to a senior civil service lawyer. Parliament pays the travel expenses of Members to commute between their constituency and Parliament. An allowance equal to one month's salary is paid to a Member after electoral defeat.

A senior civil service lawyer is paid more than Ministers, the Presiding Officer and Members in **Free State**. The constituency allowance does not form part of a Member's salary as it is paid directly to their political party. The spouse of a Minister or Presiding Officer may receive a travel allowance. Members of the Legislature receive a fixed monthly allowance which provides for office, mobile and residential phones. A Government Gazette is published and media reports disclose the salaries of politicians. The public have access to Members' expense information on request.

Members in **Limpopo** are entitled to constituency, travel and communication allowances.

Each Member in **Northern Cape** receives a Political Allowance. Members' basic salary and car allowances depend on whether they are newly elected, re-elected or re-elected and holding the same/higher office for a period exceeding 24 months.

A senior civil service lawyer's salary is more than a **Ugandan** Members' basic salary. The Presiding Officers earn more than Ministers and senior Supreme or High Court judges. Members are entitled to a subsistence allowance which is double their basic salary.

Zambian MPs are entitled to subsistence, constituency and travel allowances. Members receive a loan/duty-free concession to purchase a vehicle. A payment is made to Members who leave Parliament upon retirement or after an electoral defeat.

ASIA

Bangladesh Members receive attendance, medical and travel allowances. Accommodation is provided for all Members and they receive a loan/duty-free concession to buy a vehicle. Members' salaries and expenses are published in the gazette. A communication allowance is paid but stationery, postage and equipment allowances are not covered by this.

Funds are provided to Members in **Balochistan** to finance development projects in their constituencies. A Member's basic salary is double the salary of a skilled factory worker. Ministers and the Presiding Officer are paid less than a Supreme or High Court judge. Members can claim a communication and equipment allowance.

North West Frontier Members can claim an office maintenance allowance. The Leader of the Opposition and the Presiding Officers are entitled to additional allowances.

A **Punjab** Member's basic salary is more than the salary paid to a senior lawyer in the civil service. Members are allowed to identify development projects in their constituencies and access a constituency development fund. Housing, attendance, telephone and entertainment allowances can be claimed. Members are required to provide an annual declaration of their assets.

Sri Lankan Members can claim a driver and fuel allowance. An allowance for a cellular phone is also available.

AUSTRALIA

In **Australia** the salaries paid to senior Civil Servants and to High court Justices are more than those paid to Federal Cabinet Ministers. Income tax is paid on electorate allowances. Members receive a constituency and postal allowance depending on the size of their constituency. There is no communication allowance but telephones, mobiles, faxes, and internet access are provided in Parliament and electorate offices. A travel allowance can be claimed for overseas travel and parliamentary and constituency business. These expenses are tabled in Parliament. A motor vehicle is provided for an annual contribution. No payments are made to Members who retire or are defeated.

The **Australian Capital Territory** Code of Conduct for Ministers has advice on Post-Separation Employment. Members do not receive a pension. A leased vehicle is provided for a Member's use. Study trip and travel reports of Members are tabled in the House. The Assembly provides postage, communication facilities, stationery and equipment within reasonable limits.

New South Wales Members' basic salary is set at the level of that for a private Member of the House of Representatives in the Federal Parliament, less \$500. A Member's salary is automatically adjusted following any increase in the Federal Members' salaries. Details of Members' salaries, expenses and entitlements are published on their Parliament's Internet site.

Office equipment and stationery is supplied free to Members in **Norfolk Island**. The Assembly meets communication charges for the Member's Parliamentary Office. The Speaker and Deputy Speaker have an office allowance.

A Northern Territory Member's basic salary is pegged at \$3,000 less than the basic salary payable to a Federal Member of the House of Representatives. The basic salary is more than that of a Northern Territory secondary schoolteacher and senior civil service lawyer but only half of the salary paid to the Head of a Civil Service Ministry. A Supreme Court Judge earns more than Ministers, including the Chief Minister. A recent review of Members' superannuation entitlements resulted in new legislation being debated in the Assembly. Members are provided with a Government maintained car or they may choose to receive an extra allowance.

Queensland Members are provided with an "Allowance to Members" to meet electorate and constituency needs. Members are provided with an annual Car Allowance which may be used to offset the cost of leasing/buying a motor vehicle.

In **Victoria,** a Member's basic salary is \$1442 less than that of a Federal MP. A residential allowance is paid to Members living a specified distance from Melbourne. Members receive an Electorate Office Budget that covers most spending including training Electorate Office staff.

Members and former members in **Western Australia** are entitled to unlimited rail travel throughout Australia on government owned railway systems.

BRITISH ISLES AND THE MEDITERRANEAN

In **Alderney** States' Members are not paid a salary but receive an attendance allowance. Members' expenses are paid when they travel overseas on Committee business. A Member receives an annual allowance of up to 160 British Pounds for communications and stationery.

The **Cyprus** House of Representatives covers the cost of official communication and stationery. MPs are entitled to a duty-free vehicle every 100 months.

In **Jersey** there is now an independent States Members Remuneration Review Body (first set up in 2004) that makes recommendations on salaries and allowances.

In the **Falkland Islands** the media reports on Members' salaries and expenses. A Member's basic salary is less than that of a skilled factory worker.

In **Gibraltar** a Member's basic salary is less than the salary paid to a secondary schoolteacher. A travel and subsistence allowance is the only allowance received by a Member. There is public disclosure or reporting of Members' salaries and expenses.

All Members in **Jersey** receive the same pay irrespective of any executive office held. From 2005 all Members can claim an expenses allowance to cover communications costs. An independent States Members Remuneration Review Body (first set up in 2004) makes recommendations on salaries and allowances.

The honorarium paid to a Member in **Malta** can be compared to the salary paid to a secondary schoolteacher. A Cabinet Minister's salary equals that of a Supreme or High Court Judge salary. Members who leave Parliament on retirement or after an electoral defeat, receive two air tickets and a free, limited telephone service.

In **St Helena** a Legislative Counsellors' salary equals that of a secondary school teacher. There is public disclosure or reporting of Members' salaries and expenses and the public have access to Members' expense information on request.

Members in the **U.K.** House of Lords do not receive a salary but their expenses are paid. The basic salary for an MP is in the upper range of remuneration for a senior civil service lawyer. A High Court judge is paid more than a Minister, the Leader of the Opposition and Presiding Officers. MPs are entitled to a staffing allowance and an Incidental Expenses Provision, which is similar to a constituency allowance. The additional cost allowance permits MPs to pay mortgage interest, rent or other expenses associated with staying overnight, usually in London, as a result of parliamentary business. Details of expenses claimed for the financial year 2004/05 were published on the Parliamentary website. A payment is made to Members who leave Parliament upon retirement or after an electoral defeat. The first £30,000 of the payment is tax exempt. Members receive a winding up allowance on retirement, or defeat, which allows them to pay staff redundancies, wind up their offices etc.

A Member's basic salary in **Scotland** is comparable to the mid-range of salaries for a senior civil service lawyer. Members receive a constituency allowance and a housing allowance to cover the cost of renting or purchasing of property in Edinburgh. A subsistence allowance can be claimed up to certain limits. The public have access to Members' expense information under the Freedom of Information Act. A resettlement grant is paid after an electoral defeat.

Office costs, staff salaries, housing and constituency allowances can be claimed in **Wales**. A lump sum is paid to Members who leave Parliament upon retirement or after an electoral defeat.

CARIBBEAN, AMERICAS AND THE ATLANTIC

The basic salary paid to an **Antigua and Barbuda** Senate Member is comparable to that paid to a skilled factory worked. The basic salary of a House of Representatives Member can be compared to that paid to the Head of a Civil Service Ministry. Members' salaries were last revised in 1994. Members receive a pension after serving two terms and can draw this pension when they are 45. Non-elected Members receive an attendance allowance. A travel allowance can be claimed for overseas travel, parliamentary and constituency business. Members are covered under a Medical Benefits Scheme. There are no limits on the types of jobs ex-Members/Ministers can pursue.

The basic salary for a **Barbados** MP is less than that of a senior Civil Service lawyer. A Cabinet Minister's salary equals the salary of a Head of a Civil Service Ministry. Members receive a loan/duty-free concession to buy a vehicle. A constituency allowance is provided but communication and stationery costs are not met by the Parliament. Members receive an entertainment allowance.

The Presiding Officers in **Belize** receive an entertainment allowance. Members receive a loan/duty-free concession to buy a vehicle. Members in both House receive an expense allowance.

British Virgin Island Members' basic salaries are equivalent to the average of what is paid to secondary schoolteachers. A Medical Plan covers Members. A payment is made to Members who leave Parliament on retirement or after an electoral defeat.

In the **Cayman Islands** no income tax is paid on salaries and allowances. Members can claim a constituency allowance.

The salaries of Ministers and Members in **Dominica** are less than those received by senior civil servants. Members receive an entertainment allowance. A travel allowance can be claimed for spouses.

Presiding officers in **Grenada** can claim an entertainment allowance. Members receive a 100% duty-free concession to buy a vehicle. All Members receive a constituency allowance.

Members in **Guyana** receive a duty-free concession to buy a vehicle. Members receive subsistence, entertainment and travel allowances. Under the Integrity Commission Act every public official is required to file a declaration of income, assets and liability to the Integrity Commission.

Jamaican Senators receive a payment for every Senate meeting they attend. Supreme Court and High Court judges' salaries are more than a Cabinet Minister's. Members receive a subsistence allowance. Cabinet Ministers and the Presiding Officers receive a housing allowance. The Office of the Prime Minister provides funds to Members to finance development projects in their constituencies. Ministers and Presiding Officers receive a communication allowance. There is public disclosure of Members' salaries and the public have access to Members' expense information on request. Ministers who do not have police security at their residences receive a Security Allowance. The Parliament pays for a Member to have a constituency secretary and a chauffeur.

Nevis Island Members receive a constituency allowance and a duty-free concession to buy a vehicle. There is public disclosure or reporting of Members' salaries and expenses. The public has access to Members' expense information on request.

An MP' basic salary in **Saint Lucia** can be compared to the salary of a senior civil service lawyer. A Senator's salary equals that of a secondary schoolteacher. Members may claim housing, constituency and travel costs. They may also receive a loan/duty-free concession to purchase a vehicle. There is public disclosure or reporting of Members' salaries and expenses.

A Cabinet Minister's salary in **Trinidad and Tobago** is comparable to the salary of the Head of a Civil Service Ministry. Ministers, the Leader of the Opposition and Parliamentary Secretaries are entitled to a subsistence allowance. Members may claim a subsistence allowance if on official business overseas or 16km from the capital. Members are also entitled to a constituency allowance. There is public disclosure or reporting of Members' salaries and expenses. The public have access to Members' expense information on request. The Retiring Allowances (Legislative Service) Act allows a payment to be made to legislators who have served more than an aggregate of 8 years, who have attained the age of 55 and ceased to be legislators or who have provided medical proof of inability to perform the duties of legislator.

Members in **Turks and Caicos** receive a loan/duty-free concession to purchase a vehicle. Ministers receive a housing allowance and claim entertainment expenses.

CANADA

Senate Members in **Canada** receive a payment for accommodation and meals in Ottawa. Senators employed by or on contract with the Federal Government can only earn up to \$5,000 per year. For every dollar over \$5,000, their pensions are reduced by the same amount.

In the House of Commons, salaries and travel expenses are disclosed in the Public Accounts of Canada. The Speaker tables an annual public report of *Individual Member's Spending* in the House of Commons about office operations, employee salaries, contracting and travel costs charged to the Member's Office Budget. This report also shows the cost of goods and services provided by the House Administration to each Member. Members are provided with a high-speed communication network for their primary constituency office and, if applicable, a second constituency office. Mail addressed to Members is also delivered postage-free.

The Executive Council (Cabinet), Speaker, Deputy Speaker, and Clerk in **Alberta** receive use, maintenance and fuel costs for a vehicle. Members who leave the Legislative Assembly, including through resignation or defeat, receive a transitional allowance.

British Columbia Members who run for re-election and are defeated receive one month's salary for each year of service. The Head of a Civil Service Ministry receives a higher salary than a Cabinet Minister.

Members in **Manitoba** can give to charities or non-profit organizations in their constituencies and claim a refund out of their Constituency Allowance. There is also a Transition Allowance and Members elected before April 25, 1995 are eligible for severance pay. The Legislative Assembly and Executive Council Conflict of Interest Act limits the types of jobs Ministers can pursue.

The **New Brunswick** Legislative Assembly is not subject to the Right to Information Act. Ministers who leave the Legislature must wait a year before entering into any Government contracts.

There is no cap on postage and communications costs for **Newfoundland and Labrador** Members. Members who leave Parliament on retirement or after an electoral defeat receive a severance payment. A Members' basic salary equals the average salary paid to a secondary schoolteacher.

In **North-west Territories** the Head of a Civil Service Ministry is paid more than the Premier or a Cabinet Minister. Members are covered under a medical plan. The Legislative Assembly and Executive Council Act, allows the public to access the financial records of any Member. A transition allowance is paid to Members who leave the Legislature after an electoral defeat.

A **Nova Scotia** Member's basic salary is less than that of a secondary schoolteacher. Ex-Members and Ministers cannot take up employment contracts with the Province for six months. Members who leave the Legislative Assembly, including through resignation or defeat, receive a severance payment.

There are certain specific limits provided for in the **Quebec** Lobbying Transparency and Ethics Act that apply to the Ministers and Members of the Cabinet about the conduct of lobbying activities. A Member who resigns as a Member of the National Assembly, is defeated in an election or serves out his term as a Member, but is not a candidate in the next election, is entitled to a transition allowance.

The public in **Saskatchewan** has access to Members disclosure statements but cannot seek expense information.

INDIA

In the Rajya Sabha of **India**, all positions, except the Chairman, are paid the same salary. This applies to the Lok Sabha as well, except the Speaker is also paid the same as Members and Ministers. Every member is given a grant under the "Members of Parliament Local Area Development Scheme" (MPLADS) to carry out development work in their constituency. Members are given free use of a flat or bungalow while in office. A spouse accompanying a Member is entitled to travel on trains to any part of India. A Members' spouse is also entitled to make use of the Members air travel allowance.

In **Himachal Pradesh** the Chief Minister and Ministers are paid less than the Head of a Civil Service Ministry or a High Court judge. Every Member receives a loan to buy a motorcar or to build a house. Funds are provided to Members to finance development projects in their constituencies. Members receive a constituency allowance. A Member's' spouse is allowed to escort the Member on travel in India. There is public disclosure or reporting of Members' salaries and expenses. The public has access to Members' expense information on request.

In **Manipur** a Cabinet Minister, the Speaker and the Leader of the Opposition are paid the same salary.

In **Meghalaya**, there is a grant and a Member of the Legislative Assembly scheme to finance development projects in constituencies.

Under the Right to Information Act the public in **Rajasthan** have access to Members' expense information on request. Members receive constituency, housing, attendance, postage and equipment allowances.

Members and office-holders in the **Jammu & Kashmir** Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly are paid the same salary. Members can access a housing loan and receive a loan/duty-free concession to buy a vehicle. A Member's spouse or family member is entitled to a travel allowance.

Members' medical expenses are refunded in Nagaland.

In **Pondicherry,** a Member's basic salary is less than that paid to a secondary schoolteacher. Funds are provided to Members to finance development projects in their constituencies.

Ministers and Presiding Officers in **Uttaranchal** receive the same salary. Each Minister, Presiding Officer, Deputy Presiding Officer and the Leader of Opposition is entitled to a fully furnished House. Other Members receive a housing allowance. Funds are provided to Members to finance development projects in their constituencies. A car loan is provided to Members.

A **West Bengal** skilled factory worker's annual salary is more than a Member's basic salary. Members are provided with accommodation in the State Legislator's Hostel or State Guest House. The Assembly meets communication and stationery costs. Members receive an allowance for books and periodicals. The Chief Minister and Ministers receive an extra allowance and an increased constituency allowance. Funds are provided to Members to finance development projects in their constituencies under an Area Development Project.

PACIFIC

Members in **New Zealand** who leave Parliament on retirement or after an electoral defeat receive three months salary and Members first elected before 1999 have rebated travel entitlements for life. Members' salaries and expenses are made public. Each Member has a support budget that can be used for postage, printing, equipment, stationery, advertising and renting an office. If on parliamentary business, Members can claim unlimited domestic air travel, access to taxis and rental cars. A Member's basic salary is double that of a secondary schoolteacher.

Ministers and the Presiding Officers in **Samoa** are entitled to a free phone, free postage and a vehicle. A Member's basic salary is comparable to that of a senior civil service lawyer.

SOUTH-EAST ASIA

In **Perlis** a Minister and the Presiding Officer is paid the same salary as a Head of a Civil Service Ministry. Members are entitled to attendance, subsistence, entertainment and travel allowances. Funds are provided to Members to finance development projects in their constituencies. A postage and communication allowance is available. An allowance for a driver is available.

Ministers, the Speaker, and Assistant Ministers in **Sarawak** are entitled to a housing allowance. Members receive an attendance and subsistence allowance. Members can access a rural project fund. A medical plan and free medical facilities are provided.

Funds are provided to Members to finance development projects in **Terengganu**. Members receive a loan/duty-free concession to buy a vehicle. Members are entitled to housing, entertainment and travel allowances. The Assembly pays for communication and postage charges.

In **Singapore** the basic salary differs for Elected MPs and Nominated and Non-Constituency MPs. Members are entitled to a Staff Allowance. A travel allowance can only be claimed for overseas conferences and official visits.

USING THIS SURVEY

It is particularly important to note that salaries are quoted at a **per annum** rate, unless otherwise stated.

The terms used to denote salaries and allowances and other matters often vary between Parliaments. We have thought it better to retain the terminology of each Parliament, since the context makes clear the meaning intended.

Similarly we have given the salaries and allowances in the local currency without converting them into sterling or dollars. For ease of comparison, we have provided a currency table, which converts the currency unit of Commonwealth countries into pounds sterling and United States dollars.

In several of the Indian entries, the term lakh is used to denote one hundred thousand.

It is **essential** that when looking at the salaries of office holders, the answer to "Are Ministerial and Presiding Officer's salaries <u>additional</u> to a Member's basic salary?" is taken into account. The question appears at the end of Box 2. If an office holder's salary is additional need to be added together to give the total salary.

Users of this survey are advised to read the entire entry for a particular Branch, as on occasion there are other payments or allowances made to Members which are noted under section 11.

RESULTS

The survey details the responses of Commonwealth Parliaments. It includes details of national, state, provincial and territorial parliaments.

Not surprisingly, since the economic and social conditions of member countries differ so widely, the overall impression of this survey is one of variety. But in the vast majority of countries it is accepted that Members of Parliament should be provided with means, whether a salary, allowances, facilities or services, that enable them to perform their parliamentary duties effectively.

COMPARATIVE SALARIES

Section 3 attempts to provide data so that the salaries of Parliamentarians can be compared with the salaries paid to other types of worker in the same jurisdiction.

There is of course an enormous range across the Commonwealth in the basic salary paid to Members of Parliaments.

In addition to the office holders specified in the questionnaire, several Branches pointed out that Leaders of other official opposition parties, and their Whips, also receive an additional salary.

TAXATION

In many of the Parliaments in the survey, the salaries of Members are taxed.

PENSIONS

Many Parliaments provide either contributory, or non-contributory pensions. Several do not provide a pension plan.

ALLOWANCES

In a majority of Parliaments, Members receive attendance and/or subsistence allowances. Frequently these are paid according to attendance or time spent on parliamentary business.

Allowances for travel and constituencies cover a wide variety of geographical and demographic circumstances.

REVISION OF SALARIES AND ALLOWANCES

The process of revision varies from Parliament to Parliament. While several Parliaments in the survey only revise "occasionally" or "irregularly", others do look at salaries and allowances once a year or after every general election. In some state or provincial Legislatures, revision is related to that of federal Parliaments.

BENEFITS AFTER LEAVING PARLIAMENT

It will be seen from this section of the questionnaire that several Parliaments, recognizing the difficulties faced by ex-Parliamentarians, do make some sort of financial payment to ease the transition back to non-parliamentary life. Such benefits can include relocation allowances, or one-off payments linked to the level of their parliamentary salaries. Some of these payments are only available to Parliamentarians who fail to get re-elected or have to resign for health reasons.

EMPLOYMENT AFTER PARLIAMENT

In some jurisdictions former Parliamentarians are limited (usually by a time-constraint factor) as to which occupations they can follow upon leaving Parliament. Such measures are intended to prevent a former Member from being able to derive unfair advantage from contacts made and information accrued during his or her parliamentary career.

Mailing privileges begin on the day that notice of the Member's election is published by the Chief Electoral Officer in the *Canada Gazette* and end 10 calendar days after Parliament is dissolved or 10 calendar days after the Member ceases to be a Member.

5. PARLIAMENTARY ALLOWANCES IN ADDITION TO MEMBERS' BASIC SALARY (continued)

Allowance for telephones/faxes/Internet/E-mail:

All telecommunication equipment and service costs for the Ottawa office and each primary constituency office are centrally managed and funded by the House Administration. Members are also provided with a high-speed communication network for their primary constituency office and, if applicable, a second constituency office. Members may charge additional services, equipment and peripherals to their Members' Office Budget.

Allowance for stationery:

Members are provided with a reasonable quantity of office supplies and stationery for their Ottawa and constituency offices at House Administration expense. Other supplies can be charged to their Members' Office Budget.

Allowance for equipment:

In Ottawa, each Member is provided with an equipped office within the parliamentary precincts.

In the constituency, following an election, the new Member assumes custody of existing constituency office furniture and equipment from the previous Member. Members may use their Member's Office Budget to purchase or lease from any supplier furniture and equipment required for a typical constituency office, including computers, fax machines, telephones, desks, chairs, bookcases, filing cabinets, photocopier and printers, etc. Members are also provided with a House Administration central budget called the Constituency Office Furniture and Equipment Improvement Fund to which they may charge office furniture, equipment, computers and peripherals if purchased from House Administration's standing offers. The Board of Internal Economy has set the amount of this fund at \$5,000 per fiscal year.

Payments for committee service:

None, except for the additional allowance paid to chairs and vice-chairs of committees mentioned in section 2.

6. REVISION OF SALARIES AND ALLOWANCES

How often are salaries and allowances revised? Every year on April 1.

The sessional allowance and additional salaries are adjusted each year on April 1 based on the index of the average percentage increase in base-rate wages for a calendar year in Canada resulting from major settlements negotiated with bargaining units of 500 or more employees in the private sector. This index is published by the Department of Human Resources and Skills Development Canada within three months after the end of each calendar year. The salaries are rounded down to the nearest hundred dollars.

The Speaker tables an annual public report of *Individual Member's Expenditures* in the House of Commons concerning office operations, employee salaries, contracting and travel costs charged to the Member's Office Budget. This report also indicates the cost of goods and services provided by the House Administration to each Member.

Do the public have access to Members' expense information upon request? No, except in the reports identified above.

Members not re-elected may be entitled to a Severance Allowance of 50% of their annual allowances if not entitled to an immediate pension and are under 55 years of age. Various conditions apply.

Members who have less than six years of contributory pensionable service receive a return of their contributions with interest in the form of a Withdrawal Allowance.

Members who are not candidates for re-election and Members not re-elected can claim reimbursement for specific expenses related to resettlement activities, up to \$15,000 within one year following a general election.

Members who are not re-elected can claim up to \$12,000 within three months following the general election for winding up operations and closing their Ottawa and constituency offices. Once for each Parliament, Members are entitled to be reimbursed for the actual and reasonable expenses incurred in moving themselves, their designated traveller and dependants and their personal and household effects from the Member's residence to another residence in or near the National Capital Region and from there to any place in Canada.

What is the tax treatment of these benefits?

Severance and Withdrawal Allowances are taxable except for any eligible portion rolled into a registered retirement savings plan.

Resettlement Provisions, Winding-up Provisions and Relocation Benefit are not taxable.



4. PENSIONS

Do Members receive a pension?

Members now contribute up to 7% of total pay to a registered retirements savings plan (RRSP). A matching contribution is made by the Province of Manitoba. The federal tax provisions governing the use of RRSPs apply.

OR

A Defined Benefit pension Plan is available as a time-limited sign-up alternative option for existing and newly elected future Members with the following major principles of operation:

- 7% contribution rate by the Member on all basic and additional indemnities;
- Full vesting of contributions after 1 year of service;
- Normal retirement age of 55;
- Accrual rate of 2% for pension calculation purposes
- The average of the best 5 years of eligible total compensation since 1995 be used in that computations

Existing Members are allowed to purchase eligible prior service back to 1995 at the full actuarial cost of same by transfer from their own RRSPs at present value or payment by cash. If legislation allows, severence pay for "grandfathered" MLAs with pre-1995 service can be used to purchase past service at the time of retirement.

5. PARLIAMENTARY ALLOWANCES IN ADDITION TO MEMBERS' BASIC SALARY

Attendance allowance per annum:

No, but there is a reduction in pay for absences in the House of \$200 per day unless an acceptable reason for absence has been provided to the Speaker within a reasonable period of time.

Housing allowance:

Members with constituencies outside Winnipeg (capital city) and residence outside 50 kilometre radius of Legislative Building are eligible for a Living Allowance if they also maintain a second residence in Winnipeg. Members with constituencies outside Winnipeg but with residences within 50 kilometre radius of Winnipeg, are eligible for a Commuter Allowance.

Do Members receive a loan/duty-free concession to purchase a vehicle?

No, however Members of Executive Council are eligible for either the use of a fleet vehicle or a monthly car allowance.

Entertainment allowance:

Under their Constituency Allowance, Members can claim hospitality expenses for the purpose of conducting constituency business. These type of expenses fall under the Representation category of the Constituency Allowance and all expenses under this category are limited to 15% of the Member's annual Constituency allowance.

Constituency allowance:

For the 2004/05 fiscal year, the annual maximum amount of this allowance is \$48,528 for Winnipeg Members, \$45,000 for Southern Manitoba Members, and \$43,320 for Northern Manitoba Members. Within this allowance, Members can claim expenses under the categories of constituency office space, office operation, constituency staff salaries and representation to constituents.

Are funds provided to Members to finance development projects in their constituencies? If so, please specify.

No, however Members can donate to charities or non-profit organizations in their constituencies and claim reimbursement out of their Constituency Allowance. Donations fall under the Representation category and all expenses under this category are limited to 15% of the Member's annual Constituency Allowance.

Travel allowance claimed:

The annual amount provided per Member is based on the size and location of the Member's constituency. The Travel Allowance can be used for authorized travel expenses incurred while acting on constituency or Legislative Assembly business. A person acting on behalf of a Member on constituency business can also claim travel expenses if authorized by the Member. Out-of-province travel expenses are limited to an annual maximum of \$3,000. No family members or other Members can benefit from another Member's Travel Allowance.

Do Members have access to free medical facilities?

All Canadians have access to free medical facilities.

Are Members covered under a medical plan?

Members are automatically covered by the Blue Cross Ambulance, Hospital and Semi-Private Plan, the Blue Cross Dental Plan, the Blue Cross Vision Care Plan, the Blue Cross Prescription Drug Plan and the Members' Long Term Disability Plan at no cost to the Member. Members are eligible to join the Blue Cross Extended Health Benefits Plan and/or the Blue Cross Travel Health Plan. Premiums for these two plans are paid through payroll deduction.

Allowance for postage:

Members are entitled to three unaddressed householder mailings (frankings) in each fiscal year. Members can also claim postage expenses under their Constituency Allowance for incidental mailings. Also they can mail individually addressed incidental mailings through their Caucus office and postage for these are paid under the Legislative Assembly global postage account.

Allowance for telephones/faxes/Internet/E-mail:

These expenses can be claimed under their Constituency Allowance as an office operation expense.

Allowance for stationery:

These expenses can be claimed under their Constituency Allowance as an office operation expense.

Allowance for equipment:

Office equipment and furnishing expenses can be claimed under their Constituency Allowance as an office operation expense and any equipment or furnishing expense over \$150 is property of the Legislative Assembly.

Payments for committee service:

Members can claim expenses related to attending a Committee meeting when held during an intersessional period.

6. REVISION OF SALARIES AND ALLOWANCES

How often are salaries and allowances revised?

There is presently no COLA in place. However, this is under review. The most recent COLA provision was calculated on the basis of the change in average weekly earnings year over year in the two years prior to the year of adjustment.

A Commissioner is determining if any COLA will be put in place on an annual basis. He is expected to report by April/05.

Expected date of next revision?

It has been recommended that a review be conducted within 6 months after every provincial general election, or every 5 years

Who/what body revises salaries and allowances? In 2003, The Legislative Assembly Management Commission (LAMC) chose to engage a one person Commission.

The Legislative Assembly Act and its respective regulations which are: Members' Salaries Regulation, Members' Retirement Benefits Regulation, Members' Allowances Regulation, and Members' Salaries, Allowances and Retirement Plans Disclosure Regulation.

Is there any public disclosure or reporting for Members' salaries and expenses? The public is entitled to look at and take copies of records required to be kept by the Assembly. These include Members' indemnities, crown contributions to RRSP or Tax Paid Trust, and dates of a Member's absence and whether the Speaker was provided with a satisfactory reason for the absence. Records are available in the Members' Allowances office. Fees are charged if search and preparation time is in excess of two hours or more than 25 photocopies are requested. The government is required to include a "Report of Amounts Paid to Members of the Assembly" each year within the Public Accounts of Manitoba. The amounts paid to each Member are provided in this Report under the headings of Compensation (indemnities, other compensation and the Crown contribution to retirement benefits) and Reimbursement of Expenses (allowances and other expenses reimbursed).

Do the public have access to Members' expense information upon request? The public is entitled to inspect and have copies of records pertaining to claims paid for reimbursement of expenses for Members. Records are available in the Members' Allowances office. Fees are charged if search and preparation time is in excess of two hours or more than 25 photocopies are requested. In addition, by June 30th of each year, Members are to prepare an annual report summarizing expenses claimed under all allowances from which they have been reimbursed and are to provide a copy to the Speaker for tabling in the House. These reports are available for public inspection free of charge.

8. BENEFITS AFTER LEAVING PARLIAMENT

Are any payments made to Members who leave Parliament upon retirement or after an electoral defeat?

Members elected prior to April 25, 1995 are eligible for severance pay of one month's basic indemnity for each year of service, up to 12 months. Members elected after April 25, 1995 are not eligible for severance pay.

There is also Transition Allowance. This is one month's basic pay for each year of service with a lifetime maximum of 6 or 12 months paid on a bi-weekly basis. A member who is defeated is eligible for up to 12 months and a member ceasing for any other reason (other than resigning outside an election period and not for health reasons) is eligible for up to 6 months continuation of basic pay.

What is the tax treatment of these benefit? Severance allowance is treated as a retirement benefit and tax sheltering is allowed. Transition allowance is taxable.

Are such persons eligible for state unemployment benefits? Members would have to apply individually to the Federal Human Resources and Development Department. Members are not covered by unemployment insurance.

Sec. 19.1(1) of the Legislative Assembly and Executive Council Conflict of Interest Act states that "Except with the approval of the Lieutenant Governor in Council, no minister or senior public servant shall, for a period of one year following the date on which the minister or senior public servant leaves office, enter into a contract with, or accept a benefit from, the government or a Crown Agency

19.3(1) states "Where a minister or senior public servant, after leaving office, accepts employment with a person, partnership or unincorporated association or organization with which the minister or senior public servant has official dealings during the year preceding the date on which the minister or senior public servant leaves office, the minister or senior public servant, for a period of one year following the date on which the minister or senior public servant leaves office, shall not, directly or indirectly, attempt to influence or assist or in any way participate in deliberations of the employer with respect to a matter in which the employer has a pecuniary interest and in which the government or a Crown agency is involved; negotiations or consultations between the employer and the government or a Crown Agency; the performance of obligations of the employer under a contract between the employer and the government or a Crown agency.

A Member and the dependent members of his family may receive medical attendance and treatment as admissible to Grade-I Government servants in any

Government/Hospital/dispensary, on the recommendation of the Civil Surgeon, the S.D.M.O. and H.O. of the sub-division in the State. For the journey undertaken to receive medical treatment, a Member may draw travelling allowance at the rate admissible to Senior Grade I Government Servants on tour, but he may draw no allowance for halts on journey. In case of a member of his family suffering from a disease requiring special treatment, actual single First Class fair is admissible to and from the place of treatment.

When the medical officer considers that a Member or member of his family needs to be Referred to a hospital outside the State, but within India, this could be done with the prior approval of the Director of Health Services, Meghalaya. In such cases for the journey undertaken to receive treatment, a Member may, on production of a certificate from the Director of a Health Services, Meghalaya or from the civil Surgeon or from the S.D.M.O and H.O. concerned certifying that the journey was absolutely necessary, draw travelling allowance as indicated above, where a Member or member of his family had been advised to seek medical treatment outside the state to obtain further medical advice.

If the medical attendant considers that it would be unsafe for the Member/member of his Family to undertake the journey unattended, the Medical Officer may either himself accompany the patient or recommend an attendant to escort the patient up to the destination. In case the attendant is a Government Servant he shall deemed to have undertaken the journey on duty and may draw travelling allowance both ways as admissible to him under the Rules. Contribution-based JSA is payable for the first six months, provided the person has made sufficient National Insurance (i.e. social insurance) contributions. Thereafter (or from the outset, where the person has insufficient contributions), JSA is means-tested. The legislation governing JSA is the *Jobseekers Act 1995* and the *Jobseeker's Allowance Regulations 1996* (SI 1996/207)

People who receive certain "compensation payments" at the end of their employment can however be treated as still in work for a period following the actual termination of the employment, and are therefore not entitled to JSA for that period. In a job where there is no period of notice due to an employee, the period is calculated using a standard formula. The total compensation payment is divided by the weekly amount the person would have been entitled to under employment protection legislation. This current weekly amount (from 1 February 2005) is £280 a week.

There is however no specific mention in social security regulations or case law of how the Resettlement Grant is to be treated for benefits purposes, and the Commons authorities are not aware of any cases involving former Members who have claimed JSA, so it cannot be confirmed whether the Resettlement Grant would indeed be treated in this way.
