Article 12 (1) - all persons are equal before the law and are entitled to the equal protection of the law

Article 12 (2)- prohibits discrimination on the grounds of race, religion, language, caste, sex, political opinion and place of birth

Article 12 (4) - allows special legal provisions to be made for the advancement and protection of disadvantaged groups.

Provincial Councils Elections (Amendment) Act, No. 17 of 2017 provides the following provisions;

- "Each political party or independent group shall ensure that not less than one-sixth of the total number of candidates to be nominated on the electorate list, and not less than fifty percent of the total number of candidates in the district list, shall be women candidates."
- "Further that, the Commissioner of Elections shall, by notice published in the Gazette, simultaneously with the call for nominations, specify the number of women candidates to be nominated on each nomination list, in respect of each administrative district."

- a) Establishing a **National Commission on Women (NCW)** to safeguard women's rights, provide remedies for rights violations, and address violence against women
- b) Formulating and implementing Sri Lanka's National Policy on women's advancement and empowerment
- c) Appointing an **Ombuds for Women's Rights** to handle complaints related to gender-based violence and rights violations
- d) Establishing a National fund for women, which will be managed by the NCW to support its financial needs and programmes promoting women's rights.
